As an independent Wesleyan Methodist congregation, and as a newly incorporated organization, it is vital that we have new Bylaws to govern us today and going forward. With this in mind, last October, a committee of dedicated members, staff and outside legal counsel began meeting to develop new Bylaws for St. Luke Church of Columbus, Inc. A draft document was presented to the Administrative Board in January, revisions were made based on their input, and the Board approved the Bylaws in March with the recommendation that they be adopted by church membership. The new Bylaws of St. Luke were officially adopted by our membership during a special called church meeting on April 17.

Now we begin the process of fully transitioning to the new structure outlined in the Bylaws. As a first step, the existing Administrative Board has been appointed as the interim Church Council. Immediately following the membership meeting Wednesday evening, the new Church Council met for the first time, and I am pleased to announce that Steve Butler was unanimously elected as the Chairman of the new Church Council. I appreciate Steve's willingness to serve St. Luke in this leadership role as we enter this pivotal time in our history. I also want to thank Richard Jarboe for his outstanding leadership of the Administrative Board at a very important point in the life of St. Luke. His calm demeanor, clear thinking and love for St. Luke has been invaluable.

Over the next few months, the Church Council, Executive Committee and Standing Committees will be hard at work planning for the future of St. Luke. We will hold our Annual Church Meeting in the fall, and I look forward to sharing our progress with you as we move forward! In the meantime, we covet your prayers that we would stay solely focused on our mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ and love one another!


