The Constant of Change

Most of the time, our bulletin fronts connect with the Sunday message. However, today I want to deviate from that formula and share something different. There is a great ministry Beatitude I heard many years ago that never left me – “Blessed are the flexible, for they shall not be bent out of shape.” These next few months are going to mark a memorable season of change for my family: graduations, a wedding, moving away (Emma – the rest of us will still be here), graduate school, just to name a few. I find it interesting that in a world that is constantly changing, we humans often tend to not be big fans of it. When I think about that, I think about it more in terms of external change and the landscape around us. However, it can be just as true for us to resist internal change as well, whether directly or indirectly, as one can often lead to the other.

Systems thinker and author Peter Senge is quoted saying “People don’t resist change. They resist being changed.” If we take Senge’s words to be true, there are few things more dangerous for us as those who aim to follow Christ than to resist being changed. Scripture talks about this in different ways. I particularly like the image Jesus gives in Luke 5:37. He notes that no one puts new wine into old wineskins, because if they do then the wineskin will burst and both the wine and its container will be ruined. In the ancient world, new wine was placed in new, flexible goatskin bags. This was done because the new wine was still fermenting and expanding and putting it in old, brittle skins would cause them to burst. Jesus was using known activity to demonstrate that old habits, rigid rituals, or many of the existing laws make it impossible to contain the “new wine” of his teaching and way of living.

As we continue to live into our reality as new creations in Christ, we must never stop being flexible, teachable, and adaptable to how God is re-making us. In fact, we should welcome every opportunity to be transformed more fully into the likeness of Christ. It often comes as the result of difficult times and challenging seasons of life, as do most of life’s lessons worth learning. As God’s people, we do so not simply for the sake of change, but because the very nature of the gospel itself requires it.
