I invite you to join me in worship this Sunday as we look at a biblical understanding of fatherhood. We will examine some biblical characteristics of a Godly father in hopes that we might, "Guide fathers, in this broken and distracted world, to know, love, and follow Jesus." 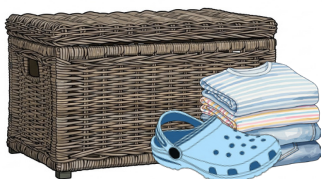

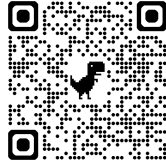
SANCTUARY USHERS NEEDED
